



## Charles Scott Keefer

August 16, 1956 - August 11, 2021

Charles Scott Keefer, 64, of Pearland, Texas passed away peacefully on August 11, 2021.

Survived by wife Rachel, and step-daughter Aubree Todd of Pearland; daughter Stacey Keefer Stanton (her husband Chris); son Jason Scott Keefer (his wife Deanna) all of Pearland, Texas; sister Jeanne Mosteller (her husband Eddie) of Boiling Springs, South Carolina; and sister Joni Olson of Tornado, West Virginia.
